- C. Writing Guidelines
  - 1. Format
  - 2. Only original typed or computer-printed papers are accepted.
  - 3. At least 8 pages-a paper shorter than 8 pages will receive a lower score.
  - 4. Double-spaced text, but single space within block quotes, references, and the abstract.
  - Use one of the standard typewriter sizes (pica or elite) or 12 points if using word processor software. Use serif typeface such as Courier or Times Roman. Defaulty setting of the word processor software is accepted.
  - 6. Leave 1 inch margins all around.
  - 7. Indent paragraphs, block quotes, and hanging indent one-half inch.
  - 8. Use left justification
  - 9. A title page is required (topic of the paper, course name and number, instructor's name, student's name and student identification number, and date).
  - 10. Number the pages except the title page.
  - 11. Use more than 8 sources including maximum of 3 website sources.

    The sources should be academic articles and books.
  - 12. Plagiarized paper will receive a zero score.
