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<p>Course Overview Learning objectives are achieved through seminar information and work experience in the criminal justice field. Seminar information is administrative coordination between the employer, the college and the student to set expectations and understand process. Work experience can be paid or voluntary.</p> <p>Learning Objectives</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Students learn on the job in a variety of work situations. ▪ Students gain experience in the criminal justice field. ▪ Students earn college credit for work experience. 	<p>DESCRIPTION OF COURSE College credit for work experience.</p> <p>REQUIREMENTS Students are engaged in a variety of work experience and are required to work thirty-three (33) hours for each credit earned. Employers evaluated the students performance and report on the number of qualifying hours.</p> <p>EVALUATION At the end of each qualifying quarter the employer submits an evaluation of student performance in the workplace and a record of the hours worked. A percentage grade is computed from the evaluation.
