D Students will examine the historical and current issues affecting education.

- Discuss strategies for effective interactions with parents or guardians to support student learning and well being.

- E4 Explore how teachers lead in the school and community to improve student learning.

F Students will apply their knowledge by observing, assisting, and interning in a classroom or educational setting.

- **F1** Develop insight and understanding for protocol related to an internship site.
- **F**2 Become familiar with school rules, procedures, and policies at the internship site and within the school district.
- F3 Assist mentor teacher with the preparation of classroom activities and instruction.
- **F**4 Assist mentor teacher with daily classroom management activities.
- **F**5 Review and assess grading policies, plan book, and methods of record keeping.
- **F**6 Demonstrate ability to work with students individually and in small groups.
- F7 Design and create a visual or display bulletin board that reinforces student learning at the internship site.
- F8 Identify formal and informal assessment strategies for evaluating students that link assessment with instruction; WASL.
- **F**9 Develop an understanding of technology used for instruction and enhancement in the classroom.
- **F10** Document evaluations that include self, mentor, and high school instructor.
- F11 Develop a simple lesson plan to include objectives, EALRs, organized activities, and an assessment of student learning.
- **F12** Demonstrate an understanding of how activities, routines, and transitions are used in classroom management.
