# II. Course Learning Outcomes

## III. Note taking Unit:

- A. The student takes a set of notes on an assigned lecture. When the notes are complete, the recall-clue column is filled out. The student completes a self-assessment of notes, evaluates his/her notes and compares them to notes taken at the beginning of the unit.
  - 1. Clearly identify major topics.
  - 2. Shows the organization of the lecture.
  - 3. Includes necessary explanation of major and minor topics.
  - 4. Uses phrases and abbreviations.
  - 5. Uses the recall-clue column effectively.

# IV. Studying and Thinking about Texts (STAT) Post Assessment.

- A. The student reads as annotates an assigned annotations in ways that help learn the material, choosing at least 2 after-reading study strategies and consolidating their annotations using these strategies. The student completes a "Self-Assessment of Annotations and After-Reading Study Strategies" and "Evaluation of Learning."
- B. Annotations
  - 1. Focus on key ideas rather than details
  - 2. Are stated in the student's own words
  - 3. Are brief and telegraphic
  - 4. Are logically organized

- 5. Include a consistent use of symbols
- C. After-Reading Strategies
  - 1. Are varied
  - 2. Are appropriate
  - 3. Include adequate details
- D. Evaluation of Own Learning
  - 1. Explains the effectiveness of reading strategies
  - 2. Explains the effectiveness of after-reading study strategies
  - 3. Identifies possible adjustments to study strategies
