Course Title: Introduction to Field Practice

Course Number: HS 281

OBJECTIVES:

1. To provide an experience that will help the students make realistic career decisions.

- 2. To provide an experience to help the student bridge the gap between theory and practice.
- 3. To provide an experience which will help the student become more knowledgeable about community resources and specific agency services.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Students in the Human Services programs are placed in a practicum setting where they have an opportunity to work with people in a human services setting. Each student is individually placed in accordance with the students career direction. Placements are made in areas such as Gerontology, Social Work, Education, Early Childhood Education, and Special Education, and Hearing Impaired. Individual student conferences are arranged to facilitate the total experience.

COURSE OUTLINE:

- I. Pre-placement seminars and individual conferences.
- II. Individual interivews with prospective field placement supervisors.
- III. Placement at an appropriate site with contractural agreement.
 - A. Specifying days, times, hours student will be at the site.
 - B. A minimum of 130 service hours in required.
 - C. Regular tasks and responsibilities must be indicated.
 - D. Specific objectives will be agreed upon between the student and the instructor.
 - E. Mid-term and Final evaluations are required. Additional evaluations and/or conferences will be completed as necessary.

EVALUATION:

Evaluation will involve the student, field supervisor and college supervisor on the following - evaluation sheet attached as well as a written summary report and personal conferences.
